WEEK 3: JOSHUA 1:1-9 • HOMEWORK 1/30-2/4 • SERMON 2/2, 2/5

Prior to any movement or strategic plans to take the land, God starts with a reminder to Joshua of His power, His promise, and His presence. Joshua, stepping into the mantle of leadership for the nation of Israel, is doing so by the power and presence of the covenant keeping God we read about in Genesis through Deuteronomy.

However, what specific instruction does God give to Joshua in 1:8 before he begins the work? Record it below.
7.	Why is this instruction in 1:8 significant as he is about to lead the people into the Promised land?
8.	If Joshua needed the reminder to not let the "Book of the Law" depart from his mouth, to meditate on it day and night, how much more do we! Has your heart drifted from time in God's word? In what ways can grow in God's instruction to meditate on it throughout our day? (*See bible study tips resource for ideas)
