WEEK 3: JOSHUA 1:10-18 • HOMEWORK 2/6-2/11 • SERMON 2/9, 2/12

Joshua is commanded by God to move the people toward the Promised Land. Before Joshua takes the first step of action, he calls the people to remember the Lord and His promise. Joshua's first response as a leader is to follow God and trust in Him. It will be God's faithfulness to His promise that moves the people toward possession of the Land.

This name of God is properly translated "Yahweh". First found in Exodus 3:15 when God reveals himself by name to Moses from a burning bush. It is the name God gives Himself, highlighting His covenantal and relational nature. It is profoundly holy and deeply personal. It's unique from other names of God because it is self-revealed.

How does understanding this name of God increase your worship and deepen your faith?
