MEDITATE

1. Read Joshua 4:1-24 and record observations below.

DWELL

2. In Joshua 4:5-7, what did Joshua tell the people of Israel to do? What did this signify?

This was not the first place in Scripture (or the last) that God would use stones to mark something significant for his people. Read through the verses below and summarize each passage.

Genesis 28:10-22

1 Samuel 7:3-17

3. What do the memorial stones at Bethel (Genesis 28), Gilgal (Joshua 4), and Mizpah (1 Samuel 7) all have in common regarding their purpose or what they display about the faithfulness of God?
4. Underline or record below all of the phrases in Joshua 4:10-18 that fulfill the promise in Joshua 3:7.
5. What significant event took place in Joshua 4:14? Why was this important for the people of Israel and for Joshua's leadership?

6. According to Joshua 4:21-22, what was the method of sharing about God's power and provision for the next generation? How does that connect to the command given in Deuteronomy 6:4-7 to God's people?

GOSPEL CONNECTION:

7. The story of God is about deliverance. We know Jesus is the Greater Deliverer, our Cornerstone, the One who embodied God's power, protection, and presence. The Greatest miracle ever experienced between God and mankind was the miracle of our sin being forgiven and our souls being justified before a Holy God.

Read Job 19:25 and record it below.

Just as the people of God stood on dry ground, we know Jesus as our Deliverer and Redeemer stands in victory over sin. And, He is seated at the right hand of the father (1 Peter 3:22). All power and dominion given to Him.
